#### **DESCENDANTS OF CLEMENT BATE/BATES**

#### by Sandy Bates

The following Family Line, is taken from information gathered by Sandy & Harold Bates, of Greene, Maine. Taken from Tombstones, Archives, Local Records. Bates Bulletin. Pictures from Walter Bates collection, and of Alice Curtis collection, passed to Sandy & Harold.

The Bates Family of Greene Maine descend from Solomon Bates and wife Aquilla, daughter of John Bates & Abigail (Bailey) Bates of Scituate, Mass. Aquilla is the Great Aunt to the Army of Two, Abigail & Rebecca Bates. This Solomon 5 is of the Clement Line. Solomon 5--Solomon 4 --Joseph 3--James 2--Clement 1.

Solomon 4 was married May 1, 1730 to Deborah Whiton daughter of John Whiton & Mary Tower. Several of the histories have this Solomon married to first Deborah Whiton & second to Deborah Studley. There were two Solomon Bates, one born Dec 25, 1702 in Hanover and the other one born in Co-

hasset, Apr 13, 1706. The Solomon born in 1702 married Deborah Whiton, May 1, 1730; and is: Clement 1--James 2--Joseph 3--Solomon 4. The Solomon born in 1706 married Deborah Studley, Dec 14, 1732. He is the Clement 1--Joseph 2-- Joshua 3--Solomon 4 line. The Bates Bulletin makes this clear. Myself and a cousin Donald Small, had discovered this, from records from Sandwich, Mass, before we ever saw the Bates Bulletins.

Greene's Solomon 5 & Aquilla moved to Greene in 1787. He had lived in his father's house on Broadway, Hanover, Mass. His Mother had passed away, and his father shortly after on March 28, 1787, He then packed up his family and moved to Greene, where he helped to form the town of Greene. In Hanover he joined the Rev. Army as Corporal in Capt. Joseph Stetson's Company, Col. Dyke's Regiment with service at Dorchester heights in its occupation by Gen. Washington. Solomon was a shipwright by trade and for several years continued this trade building several vessels on the Kennebec river, Maine. He owned a farm in Greene. He was regarded as an honest man, a good citizen and a stern and inflexible republican. They had 8 sons & 6 daughters. 12 children came with to Greene and two born in Greene. Him and Aquilla moved to Favette with son Solomon Jr. He died there in 1815, age 74. Aquilla died Apr. 1826 at 82 yrs 6 mos. They are buried in the River Road Cemetery in Greene.

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We will deal here with one of the son's John. If we go to the Bates Bulletin of Oct. 1923 page 110 we have 103 John 6--Solomon 5 4--Joseph 3--James 2--Clement 1. It says John was bapt. at Hanover Oct. 9, 1774. marr. Deborah Stetson of Hanover. Moved to Greene, Me. Where he died 1832 or 1840?. A Farmer and children were: 197 i Wheaton--ii. Jason--iii Sibyl--iv Sabrina marr. Ezekiel Bates her cousin. She died Apr 3 1897--198 v. Martin. NOW I would like to write what I know of this John. Children were <u>Martin</u> born 1800--<u>Sabrina</u> b 1802--<u>Wheaton</u> b 1805--Jason b 1807/8--<u>Sibyl</u> b 1810/11--<u>Fanny</u> b 1810.

John the eighth child of Solomon & Aquilla was b and bapt. in Hanover, Oct. 9, 1774. Came to ME in 1787. He marr Deborah Stetson dau of Bachelor & Margaret (Nash) Stetson, of Greene. He bought a farm on the north half of lot # 238 in Greene, ME. Bought for \$275.00. He later settled on a farm near Curtis Corner. He was a Farmer. Him and Deborah sold land in Greene April 25, 1836 and May 10, 1836 bought land in Leeds. They were both living at this time but by 1840 Deborah had passed away and John in 1840 according to his probate by April 10, 1840 when an inventory was taken of estate. There are no tombstones for them, but in the Quaker Cemetery in Leeds is 5 field stones. One bigger and one a little smaller and then one just a bit smaller and then two small ones. Beside these is a tombstone of their Granddaughter Julia Ann Bates, who died June 8, 1851, aet 17 yrs 8 mos, daughter of their daughter Sabrina Bates who marr. Ezekiel Bates. John had a daughter Francis A (Fannie) b Sept 23, 1810 died Aug 21, 1812. Also had a son Jason b 1807/8, and a daughter Sibyl b 1810/11. We can find nothing more on these children so believe they may have died young and buried here. We know the Leeds grave digger buried John & Deborah because it says so in John's probate, but not in which Cemetery. We puzzled why Granddaughter Julia was buried here because her parents died many years later and they are buried in the Leeds Plains Cemetery. But there seemed to be no additional places to put another person in the Plains Cemetery, then ones who are there now with stones. This all leads us to believe that the field stones are our John and family. There are

no cemetery records for this cemetery of who is buried there, and no one else has come forward saying this area is there family. John & Deborah had sold their farm in 1836 and bought another one and died shortly there after so they seemed to be in debt and son Martin got the farm for a loan owed him by his father. We feel there was no monies for tombstones.

MARTIN 7--John 6--Solomon 5, 4--Joseph 3--James 2--Clement 1.

Martin is the next person we will deal with. He was born to John & Deborah Nov. 5, 1800 in Leeds, ME. He moved to Bath ME and worked in the Bath ship yard. Marr Mar 21, 1824 Joanna Curtis dau of Abner & Lydia Curtis of Leeds. Joanna b 1804 in Leeds. She died Dec 18, 1889. Martin d Nov 5, 1861 and both are buried in the Fairview Cemetery Bath Me. They had 12 children: James b 1825, **William Orlando b Jan 12 1829**, Charles Henry b 1831 d July 18 1832 at 6 ms 18 ds,

Frances Ann b Jan 16, 1836, marr Wm. Wing, Frances Ann 8--Martin 7--John 6--Solomon 5, 4--Joseph 3--James 2--Clement 1. Marr Wm Wing Jan 22 1856, children: Roswell S b Feb 20 1857, Alena M b Apr 25, 1865, marr Nov 22, 1884, George L Beals of Greene, George & Alena had 5 children, one being Alice Margaret b Dec 15 1907, d Dec 31 2001 who marr. Martin Curtis. Buried Glenside Cemetery, Winthrop ME. Alice is the cousin who



helped with the family line and we have her collection of pictures.

Ellen b 1838, Adeline b1840, Mary b 1842, Silas b 1844 d at Sea Feb 9 1852 at 24 yrs, John Orlando b 1846, Roswell T b 1848 drowned July 25, 1851 at 5 yrs 1 mo, Joanna b 1850, Infant b & d 1852.



She died Jan 4, 1933 at 94 yrs 11 mos. They lived on the south slope of Quaker Ridge. William Orlando d Feb 27, 1900 at age 72.. They are both buried in the New Valley Cemetery, Greene, ME. Had the following children: Alden b Feb 29 1856, **Herbert Walter b Apr 23, 1860,** Clara A b Nov 20 1862, Lewis E b Feb 2 1864, Jennie M b Feb 16 1866, Langdon b May 5 1868, Cyrus Snow b Jan 28 1872, Betsy (Bessie) Blanche b Nov 30 1878.

<u>Alden Richardson</u> 9--William Orlando 8--Martin 7--Solomon 5, 4--Joseph 3--James 2--Clement 1. Alden R, b Feb 29 1856 marr. Feb 23 1874, Mary Anna Webster of Turner. She was b Feb 1857 and d 1932. He died in 1927. He was a Farmer in Fayette and raised lots of strawberries. They are buried in the New Valley Cemetery, Greene. Children are: John Warren b July 5 1874, Jefferson, (Thomas J b 1876, d 1945, his wife Abbie Elvira Milner b 1862 d 1938, both buried New Valley,) and Ethel M 1886 .



Harold was a jazz pianist. He died of gallstone infection. Harold M & wife Rena buried in New Valley Cemetery. Harold had Lewis I b Feb 7 1928 Rumford Me, d July 3 1993 Ipswich Mass. Harold had marr Helen DeCoste in 1925 Rockland Me. They div in 1932. Helen took Louis away from Maine and changed his name to Louis I Mastrangelo Jr. and had no contact with Harold. 

Marr 1<sup>st</sup> Mar 27, 1791 Hannah Stetson of Hanover d in Maine 1831. 2<sup>nd</sup> marr Sarah Daggett. He was a Farmer and probably removed to St. Albans Me. Info concerning family desired. 4 children listed. John, Seth, Simeon, Florentine.

Samuel 6--Solomon 5, 4--Joseph 3--James 2--Clement 1. Samuel had come to Greene in 1787 and settled there. He had come with wife Hannah Stetson who died Apr 24, 1814. He then marr Sarah Daggett dau of Capt. John and Mary Steven Daggett. Samuel had the title Capt. Samuel most likely acquired from service in militia. He was a Charter member of Free Baptist Church. Him and wife Hannah had 10 children. 1. Hannah b Nov 20, 1791 d in Pittsfield, marr. James Willis of Wiscasset; Me 2. Martin b Jan 9, 1794, d Dec 31, 1794; 3.Lucy S b Oct 6, 1795, d 1798; 4. Hitty b Dec 30, 1797, d July 9, 1799; 5. Deborah Wheaton b Apr 15, 1800, d in Pittsfield; 6. Abigail Bailey b Sept 6, 1802, d in Pittsfield. (Deborah & Abigail marr Leavitt Brothers and moved to Pittsfield Me. ) 7. Samuel Briggs b Nov 20, 1804, d Dec 8, 1806; 8. Seth b July 3, 1807; 9. John Stevens b May 4, 1809, d in St. Albans; 10. Florentina b Mar 5, 1811, d Dec 21, 1815. By 2nd wife Sarah Daggett. Had 4 children: 11. Florentina Means b Mar 25, 1817, d Feb 15, 1884; 12. Simeon Daggett b Feb 5, 1819; 13. Marilla b Feb 6, 1821, d Feb 3, 1887, age 66; 14. Sarah Jones b Aug 24, 1823, d at age 27.

In about 1830 Capt. Samuel moved with his family to St Albans, Me. Samuel d Feb 28, 1849 aet 80 yrs 6 mos. Sarah d Apr 18, 1873 aet 92 yrs 7 mos. They are both buried in the Crocker Cemetery, St. Albans.

# WE will now only deal with son Simeon Daggett, Direct Line of Sally Smith:

Simeon Daggett 7--Samuel 6--Solomon 5, 4--Joseph 3--James 2--Clement 1. Simeon b July 15, 1823, marr. Apr 13, 1842 Sarah Augusta Mower dau of Isaac and Sally (Adams) Mower. Sally Adams was a dau of Samuel Adams of Greene, a Revolutionary soldier. Sarah (Sally) b June 20, 1823, d Aug 23, 1861 age 38. Simeon was an most esteemed and respected citizen of Corinna, Me. Member of board of assessors nine yrs, fire insurance 40 yrs, Mason, and honored member Methodist Church. He died May 16, 1904, age 80. They had Samantha b July 21, 1843 marr June 26, 1864 Z. L. Turner of Gilford. She d Oct 23, 1867, age 24, and Isaac Mower b Aug 12, 1848, in St. Albans.

Member **Celeste Mc Closkey Wilson** is descended from another son of Solomon of Greene. In the April 1923 Bulletin Page, 103 it has the line up and including Solomon's son Solomon Wheaton.

101. Solomon Wheaton b Hanover Mass Aug 27, 1765 marr Dec 22, 1787 Mary Macomber of Taunton Mass. Mary d 1853 Fayette, Me. Solomon W was a ship carpenter, farmer, trader, Justice of Peace 30 yrs. Rep to General Court Mass 10 yrs. Senate 2 yrs. Moved to Norridgewock, Me. And then to Fayette. d 1853, age 93 yrs. Had the following children: James b Sept 24, 1789; Harriet Apr 10, 1791 marr. Hon John Hubbard Ex-Governor of ME. She d July 1828; John b Mar 4, 1794, d unmarried; Linda b Jun 2, 1796, marr Francis T Haines; George b Feb 12 1798; Silas b Feb 12, 1798, (Twin to George) Silas un married d at Havana, Cuba Nov 1821; Mary b Mar 2, 1800 marr John Starbird; Niran b Nov 27, 1801; Sophia b Dec 8, 1803 marr Asa Clark. Her dau was 'Sophia May" author of children stories; Solomon W b Aug 2, 1805; Horatio b Sept 22, 1807. We next find this family in the April 1929 Bulletin, page 29 and continues with Niran. Niran is the Line for Celeste, and so we will only follow this direct line.

My notes and what I can add: Mary Macomber belonged to the Order of Friends.. Solomon Wheaton and Mary settled in Greene for a time, and had first 4 children there. From their tombstone I have Hon. Solomon Bates died Dec 20, 1857 ae 92, Mary his wife died Oct 11, 1834 ae 69. Ann his second wife died Jan 18, ae 84. (I know nothing more of this second wife?) Son James d in 1882 age 93.; George d Jan 24, 1876 age 78. Solomon W. marr Elizabeth Dennis of Gardiner; Horatio was an inventor d in NY.

## OBIT OF EDWARD MARK BATES

**Edward "Ed" Mark Bates**, who was a Bates Association member for quite some time, passed away in Yakima, Washington on April 28, 2008. He died from complications arising from acute



Alzheimer's disease. Ed was born on June 3, 1920 in Walla Walla, Washington. He was the oldest son and third born of eleven children to Mark General Bates and Ollie Mae Deweese.

After High School, Ed worked for the Army Corp of Engineers and was a member of the Washington

National Guard until he enlisted in the Army Air Corp at the beginning of World War II. He flew several missions over Germany as a tail gunner in a B-24 Liberator bomber and was awarded the Purple Heart when the last B-24 (The Night Raider) bomber he flew in had to make a belly landing upon arrival back to England.

While he became a disabled American Veteran following that flight after losing two fingers on each hand due to frost bite, his injuries never slowed him down. He had a 30+ year career working as a Correctional Officer inside of prisons and jails in Washington, Oregon and Arizona. He was an avid hunter and fisherman and was also active in Youth Sports in Walla Walla and later the Eugene, Oregon areas.

Many of The Bates Association (TBA) members know his son, Stan Bates, who is our Communications Coordinator. His wife, Fern Christina Bates, who also was a TBA member, passed away in January of 2006. Besides Stan, Ed is survived by a brother, Gene Bates of Clarkston, Washington, and three sisters; Joan McRae of Milton-Freewater, Oregon; Shirley Fuller of Walla Walla; and Opal "Elaine" Bates of Portland, Oregon. He also leaves behind 8 grandchildren and 10 great-grandchildren.

Ed was a man of strong will, determination and tenacity as well as a fierce competitor. While some might say he was out-spoken, none who knew him believed he was not forth coming or afraid to stand up for that which he believed. He followed the cornerstones of his life: His God, His Country, His Family, and His Honor as a man.


#### **OBIT OF FRANCIS MAZUR**

His lineage was from Ormus Ariah Bates, Orson Parley Bates, Ormus Ephraim Bates and Phoebe Maria Matteson.


